



## Oplenova hiša The Oplen House

Studor 16, 4267 Srednja vas v Bohinju

The Oplen House beneath Studor is a living culture museum from the beginning of the 20<sup>th</sup> century, equipped

with the original furnishings of its last owners. What is characteristic of this house is that both its living and working quarters are under one roof. In the living quarters, a kitchen with an open hearth is conserved which is still functioning. The central living area is called *hiša* [a house], and next to it is *kamra* [a room] for the elders. The attic or the so-called *ispa* served as a storage room for crops, tools and clothes.

The working area of the house is equipped with farming tools. It comprises a stable, a barn and a special litter storage area. There are three traditional events organised in the museum every year: The Old-Way Sewing on the Summer Museum Night in June, Corn Husking in autumn and New Year's Carolling on St. Stephen's Day [26 December].

## Planšarski muzej The Alpine Dairy Museum

Stara Fužina 181, 4265 Bohinjsko jezero

The Alpine Dairy Museum presents the history of cheese trade and Alpine dairy-making in Bohinj. It is housed in the abandoned village cheese-dairy where cheese was still made as late as 1967. The original cheese-making workshop is preserved in the museum, with two large kettles for making cheese, presses for shaping it and original tools and utensils. A typical wooden Alpine herdsman hut and all its furnishings from the Zajamniki mountain pasture is also on display. Life in Bohinj mountain pastures is presented through various artefacts which reveal a wealth of ethnological heritage in this area.

The Museum of Tomāž Godec in Bohinjska Bistrica is located in the birth house of Tomāž Godec (1905-1942), a local tanner, an extraordinary skier and organiser of sports in Bohinj. Today, a cross-country skiing memorial in Bohinj is called after him. He was the first partisan in Bohinj and one of the leaders of the so-called Bohinj Uprising against German invaders in 1941.

Renovated museum houses a permanent exhibition on the history of Bohinj, from the first prehistoric settlement to both World Wars. Economic activities, customs, language and many creative dwellers of Bohinj reveal how rich was the past here. One part of the permanent exhibition is dedicated to tannery.

Interesting temporary exhibitions, museum evenings and occasional workshops for children and adults are also being held in this museum.
